"No Condemnation" Romans 8:1-4

Preparing the Way for Romans 8

- Romans 8 provides the solution to the struggle between the two natures/dispositions.
- Romans 8 and its first two words finds its roots in the previous chapters.
- Romans 8 explains the blessings associated with our relationship to Christ.
- I. The believer's relation to Christ makes freedom from the law of sin and death possible (8:1).
 - Our wretchedness does not condemn us.
 - As a Christian, I am not condemned because I still have a sin nature.

- II. The believer's relation to the Holy Spirit makes freedom from the law of sin and death possible (8:2).
 - The Christian possesses a power superior to the power of the law of sin and death.
 - The Holy Spirit works within the believer to produce the fruit of justification.
- III. The believer's relation to the atoning work of Christ (8:3-4).
 - How is the law of God limited?
 - What is so good about Christ's offering for sin?
 - What is the requirement of the Law (8:4)?
