God's Man – A Husband Who Loves His Wife Ephesians 5:25-33

- I. The husband is to love his wife with a sacrificial love (5:25).
 - A. This is a decision (actually thousands of decisions). It is God's will that is to be fulfilled.
 - B. This love requires supernatural enablement. The kind of love involved is the fruit of the Spirit.
 - C. This love is to be generous. It is a life-long gift of grace. It is not dependent on his wife's response.
 - D. This love involves suffering and death. Marriage is a call to die. Marriage is a call to pain.
 - E. This love involves intercession. "Giving ourselves for our brides involves prayerful intercession."
- II. The husband is to love his wife with a sanctifying love (5:26, 27).
 - A. The husband is to carry out the love-work of cleansing his wife by the Word.
 - 1. The husband is married to a sinner.
 - 2. The husband must be a seeker of God.
 - 3. The husband is to be a man of the Word.

- B. The husband, in exercising sanctifying love, will consecrate his wife to become what God wants her to be.
 - 1. Do I provoke my wife to wrath and discourage her with my anger and critical spirit?
 - 2. Do I show her affection and give her enough so as to minimize her vulnerability to the appeal of other men?
 - 3. Do I give her the freedom to pursue her interests, to seek God, to study the Bible, to have friends?
- C. The husband in exercising sanctifying love will complete her.
 - 1. Completing love doesn't retaliate when my wife irritates me by leaving the gas tank on empty.
 - 2. Completing love seeks to help her when someone has criticized her.
 - 2. Completing love thinks about how my behavior will affect my wife.
- III. The husband is to love his wife with a caring love (5:28-30).
 - A. Caring love seeks to understand one's wife.
 - Her physical state
 - Her thoughts, ideas, values, goals, likes, dislikes, and viewpoint
 - Her emotional and social condition
 - Her spiritual state
 - B. Caring love exercises leadership, provides, and protects.
 - 1. The husband will provide for his wife.
 - 2. The husband will protect his wife.

3. The husband will exercise spiritual leadership.

Conclusion – The loving husband's resolve – 1 Cor. 16:13, 14

- I will resolve to be alert to the spiritual realities of this world.
- I will resolve not to allow the problems of life to diminish my love God and His Word.
- I will resolve by God's grace to exercise courage in the face of all dangers.
- I will resolve to structure my life for biblical change.
- I will resolve to love to devote myself to love as Christ has loved me.

He has given me a model by which to live;
To Him I will joyfully submit that I might give.
There is a treasure which He has bestowed;
She is my wife with whom I might grow.
And with my partner I will faithfully abide;
